Re: Site Inspection on the 15th Septem er 2004

Dear Mr. Ogg,

Mr. Ray Spain met with Mr. Thomas Smith on-sit. at 10.00am and carried out an inspection. A summary of the inspection and items for the next inspection are as follows:

- 1. Noise present on the site was from ongoing construction works and from the operation of the screen and did not appear excessive.
- 2. Some small amount of litter was noticeable adjace it to the screener. There was no litter visible beyond the immediate boundaries of the site. Mr. Smith agreed to have this litter collected.
- 3. The public road was clean and free from debris.
- 4. I stopped in the village of Rathcabbin to check for odour. No unusual odours were detectable. I also stopped 100.0m from the facility; again no unusual odours were detectable. A slightly earthy odour was noticeable at the entrance to the facility. This odour was more pronounced within the facility but could not be considered strong. Mature compost was being screened at the time with excavators r emoving c ompost from the large storage h eap, p lacing it in the screening machine, with the screened material being placed into the concrete bays and the screenings being placed in the creenings storage heap. All compost heaps, other that those been worked on, vere covered.
- 5. Records were inspected and the following was $n \in ted$; Records were present from the weigh bridge for naterial arriving on site. Source of material was identifiable in dockets with time and date of receipt. Waste material leaving the facility was weigh and docketed.

6. Liquid from composting tunnels is been collected into storage tanks and was being recycled back onto compost at the time of visit. Excess liquid, due the layout of the drainage, cannot escape this process.

Items for next inspection are as follows, with inspection \rightarrow be carried out during the week ending Friday 1st October 2004.

- a Storage areas for incoming waste to be designated and indicated on drawings (Permit item 4.8).
- b Quarantine area to be designated and indicated on *c* awings (Permit item 4.9).
- c Infrastructural construction program and time sce e to be discussed (Permit item's 3.2, 3.4 and 4.16).
- d Annual contribution for inspection and monitoring, calculation and invoice to be issued.
- e Inspector to be present when a consignment of we te material arrives on site so that acceptance and handling procedure is with ssed. To facilitate this, it would be appreciated if you could contact Mr. Ray Spain (087-4194549) with the expected d ate and time of a delivery of waster to the facility during the week ending Friday 1st October 2004.
