Dear Ann, Please note the enclosed information on Belgium polution, with regard to Toxic incineration.  
". In October 2002 the chicken eggs in two communities near the Indaver waste incinerator, exceeded the Belgian Standards for eggs (standard = 5 pg TEQ/g fat). The Belgian Federal Agency for the Safety of the Food Chain found dioxins value levels at 11 pg TEQ/g fat. In other words the acceptable level for dioxins in chicken eggs exceeded more than twice. These two communities (Stabroek and Berendrecht) are situated less than 2 miles from the INDAVER waste incinerator".
