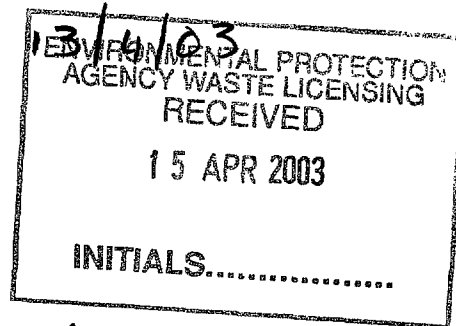

With reference to the above planning proposal, I wish to make an appeal on the application made by Indaver for an IPC License for the following reasons:

1/ Health

There is a well recognized link between the dioxins emitted from Incinerators and tumours.

2/ Damage to Food Industry

Ireland has one of the lowest levels of dioxins occurring in the food chain. Should we risk damaging our reputation as an agricultural country and damaging the quality of our food produced?

3/ Emissions

The emissions from the proposed incinerator run the risk of increasing local cloud cover, making the Newgrange winter solstice a non event.

4 Toxic Ash

The toxic ash produced will need to be transported by road, along a stretch of road with a high incidence of traffic accidents. Should the toxic ash be involved in such an incident it could cause a local environmental disaster.

I hope you will take these points into consideration when considering granting Indaver a license to operate.
