RE:INDAVER IRELAND INCINERATOR PLANNING PROPOSAL.

With reference to the above planning proposal, I wish to make an appeal on the application made by Indaver for an IPC licence for the following reasons:

Indaver have stated that there will be no waste segregation prior to incineration, how can we therefore be guaranteed that this will be a non-hazardous waste incinerator

There is no guarantee that the proposed incinerator will remain within any emission limits specified.

At present the EPA does not have the ability to analyse samples taken to measure dioxon emissions- these have to be sent abroad, therefore a problem could be ongoing for several days or weeks whilst awaiting analysis results.

Will the taxpayer have to pay for the additional personnel required on the ground to police such an installation?

How will dioxins be monitored in the food chain?

Who does the EPA use to carry out their dioxon sampling obligations at present?

Does the EPA have the ability to analyse samples taken to measure dioxon emissions?

There is a valuable local Aquifer Reserve under/adjacent to the proposed site which could be seriously affected by this proposed incinerator.

How will the public be informed of any test results?

Indaver have consistent problems with their Belgian plant, what guarantees do we have that the Carranstown plant will not have the same problems?

I would appreciate a written acknowledgement of this letter, and confirmation that my objection is a valid one.
