Re Submission regarding the proposed Indaver
 Municipal Waste Management Facility at
 Barrowstown Duleek to Meath.

As Members of the Barrowstown Residents Group
 we would like the following submission to be
 considered in the issuing of an Integrated
 Pollution Control (IPC) license to the proposed
 Indaver Municipal Waste facility at Barrowstown
 Duleek to Meath on the following grounds:

We will be living only 150 meters from the
 proposed Incinerator, and we are already inhaling
 the dust from the Platin Cement Works, 150 meters to
 the right of us. There is blasting from the quarry
 everyday, which is only 300 mts from the proposed site,
 I am afraid that this will cause a subsidence there.
 There is a constant build up of traffic especially early
 mornings and afternoons, and at times we have to wait
 upto 10 mins to cross the road, as we are situated
 on the bend of the road. We will be prisoners
 in our own homes if this proposed Incinerator

gets permission from the EPA.

Another major concern is the natural gas pipeline runs through the proposed site and should there be an accident, or an explosion, we would be in serious danger from the fumes, that might occur. Health Research has proved that emissions from waste incinerators can cause serious damage to health.

We will not be able to sell our property and we will have no privacy, and to think we have lived here for 64 years, there is no thought by the Developer given to us.

Based on the foregoing, the "Larroustown Residents Group" strongly object to the issuing of an Integrated Pollution Control license to Indane's Waste Management Facility at Larroustown, Duleek, Co Meath.
