On the shaming day, I handed you, Madam Chairman an Open Letter re aspects of the testing / monitoring regime. Independent of the licensing process, I want EPA to address the subject of Baseline + monitoring, and produce a report for reference for the entire farming community.

I have a crisis of confidence + I honestly feel that I need to engage a forensic scientist to organise my Baseline + Monitoring + perhaps miss a few payments on my mortgage to do it.
