We refer to your recent notification in relation to the above-proposed development. Outlined below are the nature conservation recommendation of the Department of the Environment, Heritage and Local Government.

We submitted recommendations to Roadstone Dublin Ltd. on 21 October 2004 on a Consultation Document. Most of these recommendations have been included in the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) for the Waste Licence Application. It is our recommendation that these should be implemented in full.

In addition Peregrine Falcon (falco peregrines) has been known to breed in the sandpits. These species are afforded protection under Annex I of the EU Birds Directive (Council Directive 79/409/EEC on the conservation of wild birds). In particular in 2002 peregrines falcons bred on the face of a sandbank within 200 metres of the boundary around area 4. Two young fledged from this site. With the amount of activity that will be around Area 4 these birds are unlikely to breed here during the intended works.
