Dear Sir,

I am writing to you with regard to a waste licence application that you have received from **Organic Gold Marketing Ltd.** The reference no. is **219-1.**

We are living in very close proximity to the above composting yards and we wish to object to the application for a **Waste Management Licence** on the following grounds:

- The obnoxious smell which comes from this plant when it is in operation, which makes life most uncomfortable and unbearable for us and for anyone living in the vicinity. This is in spite of a '**misting system**' being installed to counter act the smell. This misting system is already in use, but obviously does not work as the smell is just as bad as it was before the system was installed. People have a right to live in a rural, or any other area, without being subjected to unpleasantness and pollution.
- The close proximity of this development to the village of Wilkinstown. We feel that this is not a suitable location for an operation of this nature.
- The increase in volume of Heavy Goods Vehicles and the danger to road users which will result from this increase.
- Failure of the management of plant to adhere to conditions of their current waste licence permit and to directives from Meath County Council and the fear that this situation will continue into the future if permission is granted.
- The effect that this development will have on the value of property in the area.

We have already sent a similar letter of objection in to Meath County Council on the matter of planning permission for the above composting facility.

We hope you will take the above points into consideration when reaching a decision regarding the waste licence application.

We look forward to hearing from you in relation to this matter.
