- This facility will have damaging effects to the health of locals, and there is research evidence, which shows a direct correlation between families living near waste management sites and higher levels of foetal abnormalities!

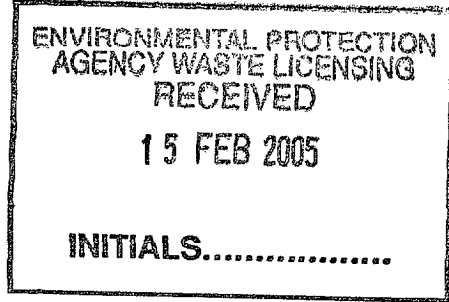

4. This plant is proposed to be constructed on an underlying aquifer which in turn feeds all the local wells in the area and also into the Kinnegad River and its spawning grounds which is a tributary of the Boyne river.
