Dear Sir,

I wish to object to a licence being granted, as above, for the following reasons:-

- (1) I own the lands adjoining Thorntons's property and my water supply comes from a well in Thorntons, which I fear will become contaminated, thus causing huge problems for my farm.
- (2) As compost manufacture cannot be undertaken without making Aspergillus spores, which distribute as the wind blows, I fear that I will have to close the stud farm which I own – see Veterinary report enclosed.
- (3) Part of my farm is dedicated by Ducas for wildlife and a facility of this nature (composting) would be totally against the aims of Ducas.
- (4) Thorntons have an appalling record of transgressions in this area of operation and have been fined twice in 2004 by EPA – E 10,000 each time.


Dear Mr Ronaldson,

I would like to make the following observations about the Kilbride Compost Manufacturing facility.

1. As with any composting process some dust will be produced (page 2 of newsletter July 2004).
2. This dust will contain some **Aspergillus spores**.
3. **Aspergillus spores** are a well recognised cause of Equine Respiratory Disease.
4. You are a direct neighbouring farm to this proposed facility.
5. The level of risk to your bloodstock would depend on factors such as:
 - (a) The amount of dust / spores produced.
 - (b) Prevailing wind conditions.
 - (c) Age of bloodstock - younger horses are more at risk.
 - (d) Distance from facility - you are a direct neighbour.

In conclusion it is impossible to say that this facility will **not** pose a risk to your bloodstock. In my opinion significant dangers to your bloodstock breeding business are involved.
