- The proposed facility could have a damaging effect on the **health** of the people in the local area and surrounding hinterlands, especially in the village of Milltownpass, where recently there has been a new **Atheistic Unit** opened at the primary school by Minister Hannafin.
- Also the bio-aerosols released by this plant could cause serious damage to animals in the region, as this is an Equine and Bovine breeding area.

We are in receipt of additional information regarding the above dated 14th February 2005.

We note that the applicant now does not intend to discharge treated leachate to the Kinnegad River tributary as outlined previously. However we are still very much opposed to this operation for the following reasons:

- The Board is of the opinion that reed-bed technology for treating potentially polluting waters from an operation such as this is unproven and will pose a risk to receiving waters. Furthermore the proposed management system of discharging only when there is adequate dilution capacity in the receiving waters is unworkable in this situation.
- Some of the proposed management practices for surface water management seem to be impractical in an operation that can leave nothing to chance. For example on page 18 of the main Response document it is stated that Analysis will determine whether the surface can then be discharged to the stream, pumped to the stormwater lagoon for reedbed treatment or taken off site for disposal. It is quite clear that this 'Dirty' surface water has a strong possibility of entering and polluting the Kinnegad River as it would be impossible to carry out an adequate analysis for such a determination.

It is clear that the applicant is allowing for the fact that there will be contamination of waters. What happens to the waters that may be contaminated on the various transport routes and are outside the area where the surface waters are to be treated?

Once again we would like to emphasise that the Kinnegad River branch adjacent to this site is a salmonid nursery stream and the main Atlantic Salmon (Salmo salar) spawning grounds on the Kinnegad River is situated at Rattin around 2 Km downstream of this site. Upto 30 salmon spawning redds (areas where eggs are laid) occur here each season and these eggs are very vulnerable to water contamination. We feel that the nature and proposed management of this operation will pose a serious risk to the aquatic habitat as there we believe that there is a high risk of contamination from this site as too much is being left to chance.

The very fact that the applicant has had to reassess his plans just highlights the dubious nature of this proposed operation.

We look forward to a copy of your decision in due course.
