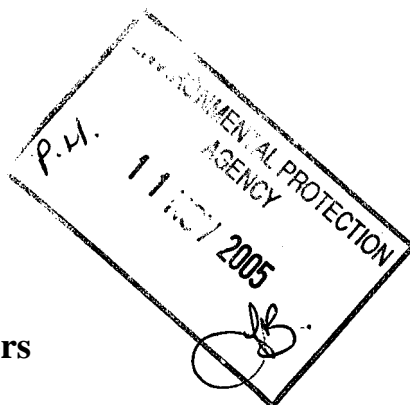

Dear Sir/Madam,

We wish to express our concern at the impact such a landfill would have on the safety of the children who attend this National School.

The R250, Fintown to Letterkenny road, which directly passes our school, is presently a safety concern to us at student arrival and departure times.

The present **high** levels of traffic, the numerous dangerous bends and intersections and the excessive speeds on the **R250** need urgent attention to improve safety.


The last thing we need is significantly more traffic on this road every school day.

Not only would there be a lot of heavy compact lorries every day but there would also be thousands of additional private cars, per week, going out to the recycling centre proposed for Meenaboll.

The most worrying aspect is the Leachate tankers, carrying an extreme pollutant, that would also be passing the school, twenty four hours per day, to the Waste Treatment Plant in Letterkenny. These tankers would also have to negotiate the dangerous bends and intersections. It **seems** to be a recipe for disaster.

All of this additional **traffic** would pose serious safety concerns for children and **staff** of Glenswilly National School.
