Dear Sir/Madam

I have been instructed by our members to lodge an objection with you to the application by Dublin City Council for a Waste Licence to run a Civic Amenity Facility at the point between Labre Park and the Killeen Road. Some of our members live in Labre Park and are worried about the pollution that will be produced by this facility. The news that there will be contained there a composting waste collection gives us extra cause for worry in this area.

Others of our members are from the general Ballyfermot Community and they are worried about the possibility of further isolation of the people of Labre Park in the future. They are also worried about the possible increase in traffic congestion that will be produced from the use of the facility.

The record of behaviour displayed by Thornton's in storing waste has led to deep suspicions as to how they or their replacements will behave in the future. The community was promised that Thornton would store the waste for no more than twenty-four hours but there is plenty of reason to believe that that promise has not been kept and the rotting rubbish has created a vermin plague.

Therefore because of the danger created by both pollution and traffic flow we wish our objections to be noted and are willing to attend any verbal hearing that might ensue.
