We are writing to express our concern in relation to a proposed con posting site in Wilkinstown, Navan, County Meath that has been given planning permission dependant on an EPA licence. We are aware of the need to deal with waste and applaud recycling as long as it is undertaken in accordance with regulations and in a location suitable to its operation. We express our concern for the following reasons:

- The proposed state of the art facility is an agricultural shed and is in no way comparative to a state of the art facility.
- The near proximity of the facility to the village of Wilkinstown, housing.! school and shop, facilities. The operation of the facility will have a hugely negative impact on the village under a number of variables: physical (water, air, noise (from transportation), visual and social. The smell emanating from the facility during its time of operation (and to this day) was unbearable. Similar facilities in Britain are located in the centre of agricultural land with minimal impact on the local villages
- Previous processing of waste breaching rulings indicate the management's attitude to the operation of such a facility a worrying indication of things to come
- There is a worry that this facility is a **front** for a **control** for such **an** operation **-** this could lead to a very large facility which does not have the supporting **infrastructure** and could impact and decimate community life and **associated** conomic activities in the area.
- In February 2005, Meath County Council made a decision based on a site visit to a similar plant in Britain that the method used for composting was not suitable. However, they granted planning permission to Organic Gold in Meath for a composting facility in July 2005. This information was obtained under the FOI Act however was only forthcoming in early Septemberthus not within the specified 4 week period to allow this document accompany the appeal to the Planning Board. This information was presented to a meeting of the community of Wilkinstown on Monday 24th October. A county granting permission to a facility (of which they were a customer) against a prior decision made in relation to the process does not particularly create an air of confidence about the operation/management of the council though their decision that it was not suitable must have been based on some criteria.

We feel that it would be remiss of ourselves not to comment on such a development particularly in light of the academic qualifications and work experience that we both have in this **field**.. **We trust** the process and the involvement of the EPA **and** we hope that **this** development is evaluated in every aspect before a license is granted.
