The facility will require modifications including some demolition and extension to the existing building, relocation of electrical substation, an in vessel composting system and biofilter, weighbridge and kiosk. An Environmental Impact Statement accompanies this application. The development will also require a waste licence at Killowen, Portlaw, co. Waterford

- 1. The composting facility is considered premature in the context of the treatment of separately collected organic waste. It is also considered to be at variance with the objectives of the South East Regional Waste Management Plan, which forms part of the County Development Plan in the context of the treatment of mixed waste and its therefore potentially in conflict with the policies of the said plans
- 2. It is further considered that in the absence of composting facilities the disposal of sludge, produced from the treatment of effluent, by land spreading as proposed is not acceptable to the Planning Authority
