Re: Shell IPPC Licence Application No. 738

I wish to have a copy of the costed Residuals Management Plan and costed Environmental Liabilities Risk Assessment which Shell E & P Ireland Ltd. committed to provide as per p.146 of their licence application.

Also, as you will be aware from the H.S.A. report provided to Mayo CC, the effects of any gas releases were not included in their risk assessment. After planning permission was obtained, Shell made a new decision to release large quantities of gas through 'cold venting.'

As stated in our submission to the EPA, Act 137(1) (a) of the 2001 Regulations states "should there be any proposed amendment to the permitted scheme which relates to the control or impact of major accident hazards, (as defined by Seveso II Directive) then that amendment shall not proceed until the agreement of the H.S.A. has been obtained." I wish to know whether you have referred it back to the H.S.A. yet?
