To whom it may concern,

I am a concerned Ballinabrackey resident and have objected to the planning application by Lagan Cement TA/50145 to burn Meat and Bone meal as a fuel source at the Killeskillen Cement plant.

As a Veterinary surgeon and expectant mother I have been very disheartened with the prospects of Lagan Cement using Meat and bone meal as a fuel source, given the fact that they have documented that they would use no such fuel source and the fact that Meath county council and the EPA could grant them permission to do so. Living beside a cement factory is bad enough and it is certainly not an area I want to live or have my children grow up in should licensing be granted.

Lagan Cement certainly do not listen to the residents and their concerns as I have complained on several occasions re the noise levels, dust and toxic fumes in the air. I should not have to put up with this.

The future concerns are that the initial burning of meat and bone meal will eventually result in the incineration of many more forms of waste at this site. What sort of an environment will this be then!!

Please take my concern seriously and help me and the residents of Ballinabrackey fight to prevent Lagan cement using meat and bone meal as a fuel source.
