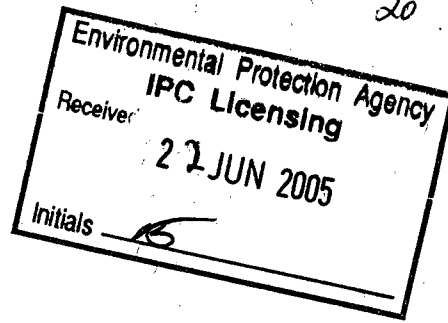

To Whom it May Concern,

I am very concerned about the fact that Logan Cement is looking for planning permission and an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control licence (ref no 752) to burn Meal and Bone Meal in its cement factory at Killaskillen, Co. Meath.

As I am living in the area close to the cement factory I wish to object to this proposal. I think that there will be potential health risks to residents, children, pregnant women, unborn children and livestock. There has not been enough research into the possible side-effects from MBM. I feel that there will be potential risk to air quality and to the water supply of the area. We will also have de-valuation of our property and lands as a result of burning MBM.

I have concerns that the initial burning of MBM will eventually result in the incineration of other forms of waste materials at Logan Cement.

We want to live in a clean healthy environment. Please excuse that this happens by turning down this licence application.
