As a resident of Ballinabrackey, a worker in the Enfield area and a part-time farmer, I wish to express my outright objection to the planning application by Lagan Cement TA/50145 to burn meat and bone meal at the Killeskillen Cement Plant.

My six main reasons are

- 1. Risk to human health, in particular children
- 2. Deterioration of air quality
- 3. Dioxins entering food chain through livestock and crops
- 4. Risks to groundwater quality
- 5. The difficulties with farming as a livelihood because of inevitable environmental changes.
- 6. Property devaluation.
