

**Re: Planning Objection**

As a resident of Ballinabrackey, a worker in the Enfield area and a part-time farmer, I wish to express my outright objection to the planning application by Lagan Cement TA/50145 to burn meat and bone meal at the Killesken Cement Plant.

My six main reasons are

1. Risk to human health, in particular children
2. Deterioration of air quality
3. Dioxins entering food chain through livestock and crops
4. Risks to groundwater quality
5. The difficulties with farming as a livelihood because of inevitable environmental changes.
6. Property devaluation.

The record of Lagan cement to date on health and safety, and environmental issues is appalling, and sooner or later the Meath County Council, the EPA, and An Bord Planala, will have to answer some serious questions on the original planning permission and the subsequent 'add-on' activities. I believe this is a further attempt to impose incineration by the 'back door' and I fear for the further safeguarding of this rural community.

A Lagan Cement statement of a few years ago, promised only to burn coal or maybe gas. How can we trust them going forward? There is insufficient research into MBM burning done to date. We don't know the full facts on BSE yet so why allow this.
