Please find enclosed some photos of a red residue which I have noticed recently on the roof of a storage container and on a water tank at my home.

I also have this residue on the rear window of my tractor. See photo enclosed.

I believe this residue is blowing in the air on a regular basis coming from Lagan Cement, Killeskillen, Kinnegad.

I have a sample of this residue.

My neighbour Denise Daly also noticed this residue in a container of water. At the time neither of us could figure out what this was, as the container was part of a feature in her lawn.

A number of other neighbours have noticed this residue on their windows. An farmers in the locality have also this residue on the dew on the grass, and on their wellies early mornings when herding.

I and my neighbour Mrs. Denise Daly witnessed the movement of dust

from this plant on the 20th of August '05 at 10.00pm.

At 1.30am on the 21st I contacted the Gardai in Kinnegad about this dust. Ruth Barrington has all details and photographs along with a lot of letter of complaints, about this cement factory. I hope you are aware of what goes on in this facility. We have noticed this dust on a ongoing basis and most of this is under operation at night time in the above plant.

The reason why I'm sending you this letter is because I believe your dealing with an I.P.P.C. Licence Reg. No. 752.



Looking forward to hearing from you.


