Dear Ms. Richards,

In relation to the above IPPC review, please find below a list of the Board's observations:

- The surface water from the site will be discharging to the Ballymount Stream, which in turn discharges into the Camac River, a tributary of the River Liffey, a salmonid system.
- Best Available Technology mitigation measures must be fully implemented to ensure protection of the downstream surface water system. It is important to note that comprehensive on-site housekeeping and infrastructural initiatives are required in order to achieve this goal. Installation of silt and particularly petrol / oil interception mechanisms on the primary surface water discharge would be essential in order to protect local surface water ecological integrity. All interceptors must be regularly maintained to ensure effectiveness.
