Thank you for your letter of 7<sup>th</sup> Nov. replying to mine of 18<sup>th</sup> Oct. 2006 emailed to the Co. Secretary. However you have ignored my letter of 24<sup>th</sup> Oct. which added substantially to the circumstances stated in that of 18<sup>th</sup> Oct. In effect it pointed out that seriously incorrect information was submitted to the EPA and appears to imply the collusion of Mayo Co. Co.

My letter of 24<sup>th</sup> Oct. makes clear that documentation recently supplied by Shell to EPA:

- purports to be an 'addendum' to the EIS but in fact alters its integrity fundamentally;
- implies that Mayo CC surreptitiously granted permission to cold-vent gas at Bellanaboy;
- claims approval of the local community for cold-venting which is demonstrably untrue.

Your letter states that "the Council has no legal power to revisit the planning application" and this is indeed the nub of the matter. The proposed refinery is designated a 'Seveso' site by the Health & Safety Authority and cold-venting of gas requires planning permission. Information regarding cold-venting was omitted from the EIS on which planning permission was granted. This renders it inaccurate and therefore invalid, as per the EU EIA Directive. Essentially, the planning permission obtained was granted on defective and deficient grounds and as such cannot be made right by means of subterfuge.

I call upon you consequently to reply to my letter of 24<sup>th</sup> Oct. in light of the above considerations bearing in mind that I have already pursued this matter very fully with the EPA and NAOSH.
