With regard to the review of licenses relating to the above facility I would like to make the following comments.

This office has had occasion to make a written complaint regarding odours emanating from Swords Laboratory to the Environmental Protection Agency on 17th May 2006. Following an investigation, it was found that the source of the odour was a particular wastestream that was sewered to the wastewater treatment plant. This wastestream comprises of 42% water and includes Acetone, Sodium Hydroxide, and Mat Propanol Chloride residues.

The primary corrective action taken by the company was to no longer treat the wastestream at the on-site wastewater treatment plant and to send it off site for disposal. This action appears to be satisfactory and no further complaints have been received by this office regarding the plant.

This office recommends that the E.P.A. includes this corrective action in the conditions of the license to formalise this procedure and to ensure that similar problems do not arise again in the future.
