Dear Sir / Madam

On behalf of my family (husband and two schooling daughters), I wish to lodge an objection to the granting of a waste licence to operate an anaerobic waste digester plant adjacent to our farm and residence at Billeagh West / Ballard, Araglin.

We live in a lovely rural area that has been designated a Special Area of Conservation (SAC) and cannot understand how such a development could be compatible with maintaining the integrity of the environment.

My daughters attend the local national school which is a few hundred metres downstream from the proposed development and thus, we are concerned re water and air pollution. This is doubled in effect by the location of our home, just under 200 yards from the site.

At present we enjoy pleasant views and peace and quiet. This would all change with the development of the site where we would be in direct line of vision of tall chimney stacks and a noisy, brightly lit development - particularly so at night.

At present, there is a wide array of wildlife ~~also~~ inhabiting the adjacent areas - water hens, pheasant, herons, shrews, squirrels, etc. The proposed development would disrupt their natural habitat and most likely they would no longer continue to remain in this area.

The possible emissions and odours which may be discharged from the proposed plant also gives rise for concern, as my younger daughter suffers from a respiratory ailment.

To conclude, the siting of a large industrial complex in a rural area of great beauty and amenity value, also in a designated area of conservation defies common sense and logic.
