Re: Application by Nurendale Ltd trading as Panda Waste Services Ltd, for an amendment of the waste licence at Rathdrinagh, Beauparc, Navan, Co.Meath

Ref: W0140-03

I have no objections to the proposed development subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Each load of waste received at the station shall be visually inspected by experienced personnel prior to unloading. A separate waste inspection area shall be provided at the entrance to the site for this purpose. Any waste which is deemed unacceptable under this licence shall be placed in a separate bunded quarantine area until removed for disposal at a designated licensed facility.
- 2. The applicant proposes to discharge surface water via the proposed wetlands to a stream which runs along the eastern perimeter of the site. The applicant shall satisfy the agency that the quality and increased volume of water is suitable for discharge to the stream prior to development of the site. Water analysis shall be carried out on an ongoing basis and the results of the analysis submitted to the agency.
- 3. Details of the proposed wetlands shall be submitted to the agency for approval prior to the commencement of their construction.
- 4. Evidence shall be submitted to the agency to indicate that the current Biocycle treatment unit has adequate capacity to treat the increased sanitary waste loading

in accordance with the EPA Wastewater treatment manual for small communities, business, leisure centres and hotels 1999.

- 5. The applicant proposes to manufacture a refuse derived fuel in the future. This operation shall be subject to a separate application.
- 6. The drainage system and oil interceptor shall be inspected and desludged as necessary and properly maintained at all times. The waste sludge shall be disposed of to a licenced facility.
- 7. The vicinity of the facility shall be kept free from any debris and loose litter. Any such materials shall be removed without delay.
- 8. Appropriate measures shall be taken to ensure that vermin infestations do not arise at the facility or in the immediate environs of same. An integrated pest control management plan shall be developed and implemented on the site.
- 9. Adequate measures shall be taken in dry weather to minimise airborne dust on site and on access roads.
- 10. Dust suppression shall be undertaken on and off site throughout the construction phase to ensure that no environmental puisance shall arise.
- 11. Local exhaust extraction shall be provided over any dust emitting equipment in the work area.
- 12. Site construction hours shall be confined to between 0700 to 1900hours, Monday-Friday inclusive and 830 to 1700 hours on Saturdays, unless otherwise amended with the agency's agreement.
- 13. Activities on site shall not give rise to noise levels at noise sensitive locations which exceed the following sound pressure limits.

55dB Laeq, 1 hour, 0800 – 2000 – Monday to Friday 0800 – 1400 – Saturdays

45dB Laeq, 15 minutes, at all other times and Bank Holidays.

There shall be no clearly audible tonal component or impulsive component in noise emission from the activity at any noise sensitive location.
