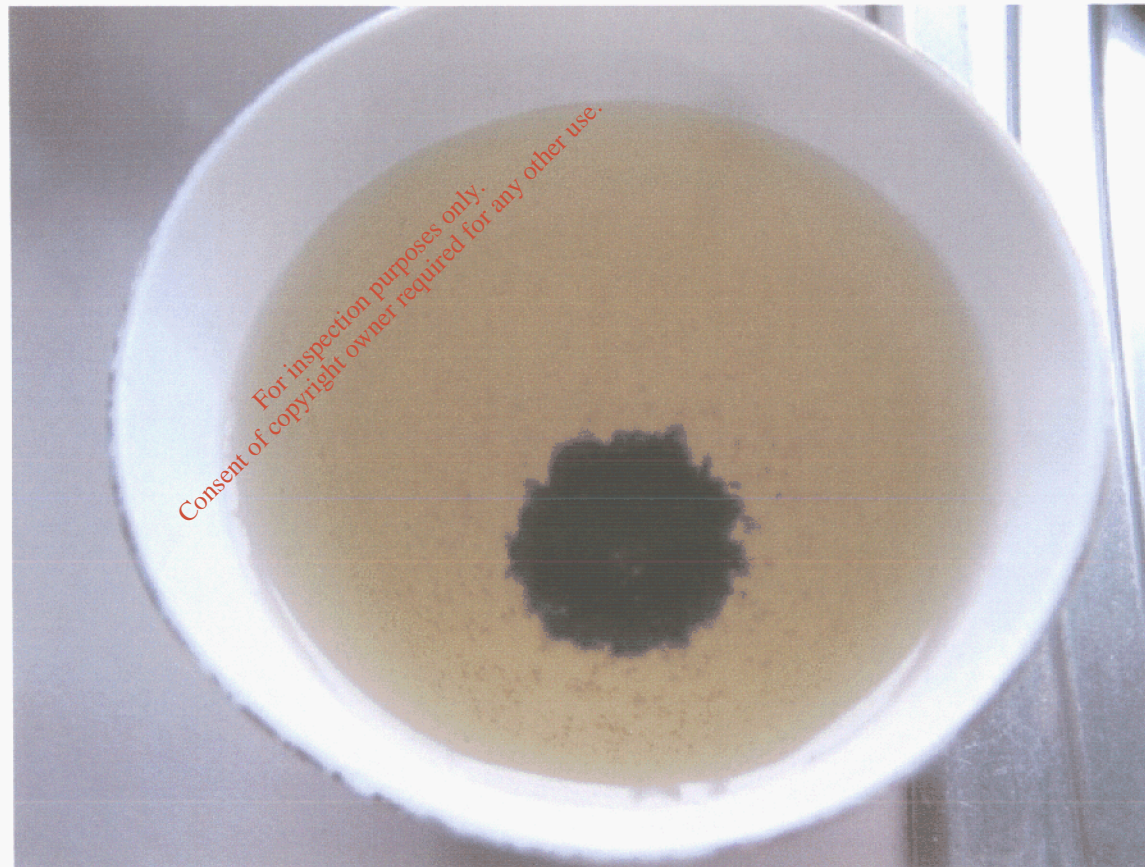

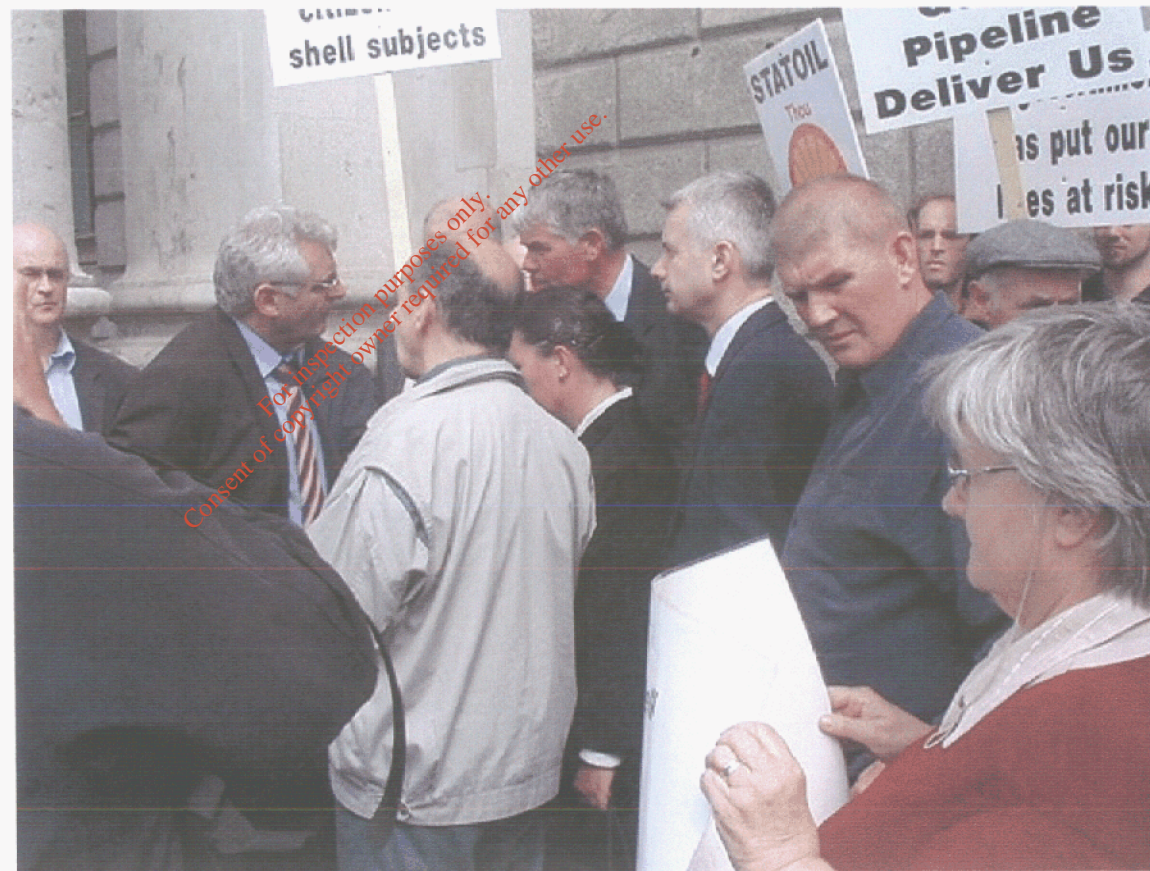

CONCLUSION

We have seen the actions of **Shell** from different corners of the world, on different projects affecting different people. The common thread is that the interests of people and the environment always come second to profit.

This single-minded pursuit by a corporation for selfish gain has been likened to the actions of a psychopath [11] in that it is irresponsible, manipulative, grandiose, antisocial, superficial, self-obsessed and without remorse. Our concern is that it is also without exception... and they say they want to be our neighbours for the next 30 years!

Shell has been operating this way for exactly 100 years, and have been very successful in their search for profits. We don't see any evidence of them changing their ways anytime soon.

CONCLUSION

As a corporate entity, **Shell** will do and say whatever it has to to get its own way, even at the expense of others. Having a clearly psychopathic nature there is no moral guidance. The bottom line is the bottom line.

The individuals given the actual job of lying on behalf of **Shell** do so under the umbrella of the “big picture”, living a life of willful schizophrenia where they can take personal comfort from their wage packets and their lives outside of **Shell**.

Those who have to live with the consequences of such amoral actions rarely have a say in the matter, and oil companies are especially undemocratic when it comes to the public good.

This oral hearing, as part of the licensing process, is one of those rare opportunities for the people affected to have a say, and we respectfully ask you, Chairman and Assistant Chairman, to carefully consider the evidence before you and recommend **Shell's** IPPC licence application be refused.

"We have huge amounts of people ... that are affected with **Shell's** dumping of tons and tons of toxic chemicals into the air. This has resulted in ... asthma, as well as leukaemia and cancer, which is prevalent, very rife and high ... in my neighbourhood fifty two percent [52%] of the educated and learned at a local primary school have got asthma, and the leukaemia rate is twenty four [24] times the norm than anywhere else in South Africa.

"... They will develop further chemical and downstream industries that will further pollute the area, and so people miles away, kilometres away will be affected. Pollution knows no boundaries...

"... People will bear the brunt for generations to come ... because people will suffer, for many years, and their great-grand-children will be suffering the impacts of **Shell** and their pipeline."

- "There is no electricity, no clean water, no medicine, no schools. Fishing nets hang dry, dugout canoes sit unused on muddy banks. Decades of oil spills, acid rain from gas flares, and the stripping away of mangroves for pipelines have killed off fish..."
- "It's not fair" Felix James Harry muttered in the meetinghouse... close to the oil and gas complex. "We can hardly catch fish anymore. Surviving is very hard..." - "Since its discovery in 1958... oil has brought both riches and woes to Nigeria... There was no federal environmental protection agency until 1989."
- "... Hundreds of flares have burned nonstop for decades, releasing greenhouse gases and causing acid rain. Communities complain of corroded roofs, crop failures, and respiratory diseases. After first ordering companies to eliminate flaring by 1994, the government keeps pushing back the deadline. Shell, the main offender, recently announced that despite making considerable progress, it could not meet the latest target date of 2008."

"The companies didn't consult with villagers. They handed out cash to the chiefs. It wasn't effective at all."

- "Well 13 in Shell's Yorke field had been leaking for five days... Puffs of smoke drifted from the iron structure. Oil dripped from its sides into a spreading lake. "We're expecting Shell, but no one has come yet", a villager said. "Soon the oil will leak into the creek over there and spoil our drinking water."
- "... the leak at well 13 had become a fire... black smoke was flooding the sky above the palm trees... "Shell keeps promising to come, but they say they need more foam and special equipment because the fire has grown so large..."
- "Well 13 would burn for two more months before a Shell team arrived to extinguish it."

Ijaw Win N210 Billion Suit Against Shell

"THE Federal High Court in Port Harcourt, Rivers State, has ordered Shell Petroleum Development Company, SPDC, to pay \$1.5 billion about (£1.1 billion) into the coffers of Central Bank of Nigeria, in favour of the Ijaw Aborigines of Bayelsa State, between last Friday and noon tomorrow."

"Shell's Sakhalin in River Strife"

"A consortium led by Royal Dutch Shell has not fully complied with environmental guidelines when laying pipelines in east Russia, documents showed on Sunday.

The consortium denied, however, that it misled the public and potential lenders who are mulling \$5 billion to \$7 billion in loans for the project.

Documents obtained by conservation group WWF and seen by Reuters, showed that contractors working for Shell-led Sakhalin Energy did not follow all the environmental guidelines...

One report noted 10 instances of non-compliance at a river crossing, while another noted five instances at a second river."

As part of its effort to secure EBRD (European Bank for Reconstruction and Development) consent, Sakhalin Energy, which is 55 percent owned by Shell, provides the bank with updates on the river crossings and publishes what it says are unvarnished reports on its web site.

However, the "Winter Crossings Report" on its web site for December 15-28, 2005, covering the period during which the two rivers referred to in the leaked reports were crossed, does not make reference to the 15 instances of non-compliance that the independent monitors noted."

CONCLUSION

As a corporate entity, **Shell** will do and say whatever it has to to get its own way, even at the expense of others. Having a clearly psychopathic nature there is no moral guidance. The bottom line is the bottom line.

The individuals given the actual job of lying on behalf of **Shell** do so under the umbrella of the "big picture", living a life of willful schizophrenia where they can take personal comfort from their wage packets and their lives outside of **Shell**.

Those who have to live with the consequences of such amoral actions rarely have a say in the matter, and oil companies are especially undemocratic when it comes to the public good.

This oral hearing, as part of the licensing process, is one of those rare opportunities for the people affected to have a say, and we respectfully ask you, Chairman and Assistant Chairman, to carefully consider the evidence before you and recommend **Shell's** IPPC licence application be refused.
