Dear Prof. Hayes

As the EPA licence application phase for this development is in the Objection Phase, the Agency is bound by statute to prescribed processes - none of which could entertain the debate you desire. In the event that an Oral Hearing for this application is held you will have an opportunity at that stage to make submissions to the Hearing in respect of your concerns. Whilst not perhaps a forum for debate as such, it will allow you to present your ideas to the Chairperson of the hearing and ask that your views be taken into consideration. The Hearing format also allows participants to put questions to the applicants for the licence in respect of their evidence/submissions. A decision in relation to the holding of an Oral Hearing will likely be made in the next 6 to 8 weeks.

Moreover, I am aware that the Minister for the Environment, Heritage & Local Government has just initiated a review of waste management practices and technologies, with an aim - one presumes - of influencing/setting future waste management policy for the State. It seems to me that your ideas would be relevant to such a review. You might contact his office to see how you might participate/inform this process.

I trust this note addresses your concerns.
