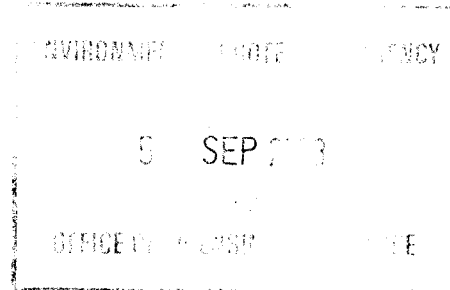




**Re: *Behan Pit at Blackhull, Naas, Co. Kildare - Letter dated 5/8/08 from the Environmental Protection Agency on Foot of an Application for a Waste Licence.***

I refer to your correspondence dated 5/8/08 relating to the above waste licence application and refer to the applicants online application form and accompanying details outlined in section B3. It is noted that the applicant makes particular reference to planning permission 592/93 and 97/1497 (refer section B3). It is the view of the Planning Authority that the applicant has failed to adequately demonstrate through the submission of appropriate documentation that a valid permission exists for the development proposed with particular reference to:

- a) the nature of development now proposed and in particular the recycling of construction and demolition waste
- b) absence of details of the restoration profile authorised under planning permission(s) (i.e drawings and details from relevant EIS(s))
- c) compliance with appropriate time periods within which restoration was to be achieved

It is recommend that the foregoing issues be clarified with the applicant.
