

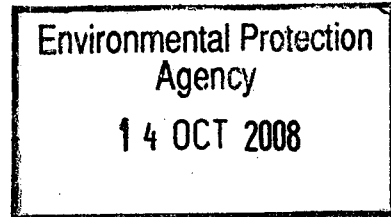

Dear Sir/Madam,

We are writing to object to an application for an increase of capacity at O'Donoghues Waste Disposal Centre, at Waterfall, nr Cork. Ref WO 214/02.

We have currently a complaint in your Co. Cork EPA office and the following is a list of our objections to this facility.

1. Illegal use of facility, i.e. Cars and vans using the facility that do not hold an EPA licence.
2. Non weight in of their own trucks: i.e. Topsoil or builders rubble.
3. Exceeded their 23,000 tons capacity last year by 9000 tons
4. The original planning application to C.C.C. stated that they foresaw that volume would be reducing in the future not increasing.

5. Our country roads are not suitable for this volume of traffic.
6. The noise level from the volume of traffic passing our dock exceeds acceptable level and has become a nuisance.
7. Trucks are in use beyond normal business hours: i.e. 40 ft. trucks passing up to 10.30 - 11.30 at night.
8. Litter constantly being left on roads.
9. Overloading of ships, no nets covering some loads.

I ideally we would prefer that the capacity of this facility would be reduced by 9,000 tons per year instead of increasing further.
