**RE:** Notification of a proposed decision on a review of waste licence for Bord na Mona at their Drehid Waste Management Facility. Waste Licence Register No: WO21-02

Further to my previous submission I object to the proposed granting of the above licence.

It has already been established that this landfill has caused a serious fly infestation in the community in this summer 2008. This licence should not be granted until it is proven that this problem is resolved and we cannot know this until we see if we have the same issues in the Summer of 2009.

Furthermore, considering that the issue of fly problem has been established, the licence itself does not go far enough to protect the community from this issue. There is no provision for Bord Na Mona to monitor this situation themselves or to report on the daily conditions of the landfill site in relation

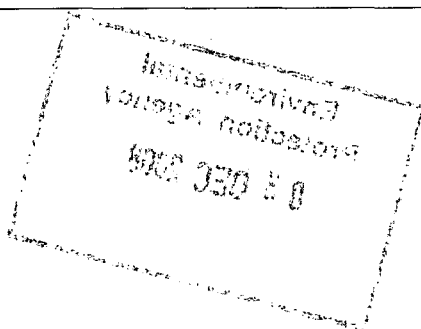

to flies or the use of pesticides in their control. Considering that the Landfill site has violated the quality of life in our community, the onus should be on Bord na Mona to monitor and report on this issue. It is not up to the community to inform Bord na Mona when they are not doing their job properly. It is Bord na Mona's duty to the community to initiate monitoring of the issue of fly infestation in our environment and initiate communication to the community on its status. This should be done on an ongoing basis for the duration of the life of the facility. I don't think that this too much to ask considering that we have had to endure the stress of having to control this nuisance and put up with this risk to our health.
