

Re: Condition 3.13 "The road to Fort Davis and the Calor depot is not a public road". This line is quoted from the objection made by the applicant on 5th November 2008. I would like to highlight that this is where the site notice was said to be present as per the regional inspector.

The applicant are therefore supporting the case that I made in my previous objection that there was **NO** site notice for viewing inspection by the general public in an area accessible to the general public and it repeat my point does this fact compromise the validity of the application.

With this information taken into consideration in my opinon it puts more emphasis that the general public did not have the opportunity to put forward their objections or submissions to this IPPC licecice application. Bord Gais state that they made an "error" in the licence application in relation to the air emissions, this is very worrying that it is only at this late stage that they noticed an error for something that is of great importance. In my opinion this is another reason why I feel the applicant should re apply so that any persons who might have taken an intrest in the file and might have not had some concern regarding the levels might now due to the fact that the emission levels are set to double.

The following concerns were also raised:

The use of meteorological data from Cork Airport instead of data from the nearby Roches' Point in the application.

Response:

Metoeorological data has not been generated at Roches point since 1991, and data generated prior to 1991 did not include cloud cover. For these reasons it is considered that Cork Airport data is more suitable.

Have occupational exposure limits (OELs) for substances emitted from the installation been looked at with regard to exposure to nearby residents and employees?

Response:

Exposure to such substances within the workplace is a matter for the Health and Safety Authority. Exposure to pollutants from the installation outside the site boundary is dealt with in detail in the inspector's report, and concludes that emissions from the installation will not have any significant adverse impact on the environment, including the health of local residents.

Was a site notice erected with regard to the IPPC licence application, as Mr Stafford does not recall seeing such a notice?

Response:

*

The application includes site maps indicating the locations of these site notices, as well as a copy of the site notice; newspaper notice, and the letter to Cork County Council in notification of the submission of the application. The site maps indicate four locations in the vicinity of the WIPP and refinery boundaries as having site notices erected. One of these site notices (at the entrance to the power plant) remains in place at present.

In conclusion Mr Stafford requests that full attention is given to his submission, for the protection of the local environment.

Bord Gáis Éireann, Gasworks Road, Cork, is applying to the Environmental Protection Agency for an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control Licence for the Whitegate Independent Power Plant at Whitegate (Corkbeg and Glanagow townlands), Co Cork, national grid reference E182735, N062480. The licence is for an activity in the First Schedufe of the Protection of the Environment Act 2004, Class 28 - The operation of combustion installations with a rated thermal input equal to or greater than 50MW. An environmental impact statement will be submitted to the Agency with the application. environmental impact statement and any further information relating to the effects on the emissions from the activity which may be furnished to the Agency in the course of the Agency's consideration of the application, will be available at the headquarters of the Agency. Copies of the environmental impact statement have been submitted to Cork County Council. A copy of the application for the licence may be inspected at or obtained from the headquarters of the Agency as soon as is practicable after receipt by the Agency of the application for the licence.
