To whom it concerns: We object to the above proposal for the following reasons:

1. If the Developer intends to adhere to planning laws, there is no need to form a new, off-theshelf company. BUCHPA LImited is a shelf company, set up, it would appear, solely to assist in avoiding financial liability should the developer breach the planning laws as regards this site.

2. You will have already noted from earlier objections you have received from our neighbours that the Developer has very seriously misrepresented his intentions in this application. It has followed the old duplicitous methodology whereby a modest proposal is submitted with a view to a much larger one in the immediate aftermath. This is in keeping with that pattern of expansion.

3. There are three existing developments within walking distance of this site that would greatly encourage any rogue Developer to proceed with a view to amassing great profits illegally.

4. A bona fide Developer would make an application under the auspices of a pre-existing and trading, accountable company, Such company would, in the event of an unforeseen breach of statutory duty, or other negligent act, be fully solvent and properly funded to discharge the cost of any potential reckless behaviour by the Developer.

5. The valley in question is one of immense natural beauty, overlooking the Irish Sea, Wicklow Head, and the lighthouse. It is very much appreciated by local people and the view is clearly visible to passing motorists on the N11, our main national tourist route from Dublin to Rosslare. The massive and continuing arrivals and departures of large, rubbish-filled-trucks all-day from the N11 would ALSO be clearly visible to passing motorists. A massive dump is not something that should be in full view in the Garden of Ireland. Our country's astonishing natural beauty is the trait most associated with Ireland internationally. If we allow it to be defiled by permitting \underline{A} <u>COLOSSAL DUMP</u> to be situated in full view of motorists driving past on the main tourist route through the Garden of Ireland, we must be blind. It's like putting a toilet in a beautiful living room.
