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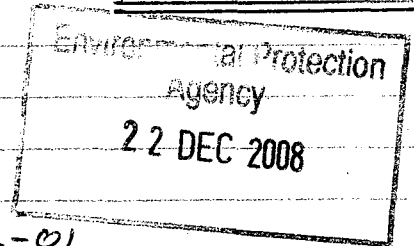

We would like to make our observations to
the above proposed developments.

The environment section of WWC. state that there are 15 waste permits in Co. Wicklow, with a further 8 permits pending. These should well serve the CEP waste Sheddings from Co. Wicklow.

There are plenty accessible spaces in Co. Wicklow that offer enormous space, created by quarrying & rock extraction, often close to the N11 + N81.

Surely, these dormant spaces would be more suitable to the displacement of CEP waste from wherever it comes.

The scarring effects by such a lengthy assault, (operations estimated to be 15-20 years!) on this scenic setting would be highly destructive of this area's natural beauty. Ref. EIS-scale of proposed development to be 4,230,000 tonnes.

It seems the developers are using the 'land fill' option to seize a commercial opportunity at the expense of the environment, and all who live in, and who visit this place of special natural beauty which has been there since the ICE AGE!

The duration & intensity of the proposed operation will also present a great road safety hazard to all who use the road.
