Re: Complaint received on 24.02.09 of effluent pipe discharging directly into a stream at bottom of AES site near dark road.

Complaint No. 3131

On 24/02/09 I visited the AES site at Springfort, Nenagh and met with Liz Adare. She showed me around the site, she is not very familiar with the layout of the site. I observed an open drain on the Northeast corner of the site. The water in the drain was stagnant and grey in colour.

Ms Adare asked if I would visit the site again the following day as the site manager could show me around the site.

I visited the site on 25/02/09 and met with Liam - Site manager. He pointed out the bin and lorry wash area adjacent to the office building, this discharges with the hardstanding area west of the main building to an oil interceptor and is then directed to the open drain. Storm water collected from the east of the main building is directed to the open drain also. There is a septic tank on site. A holding tank adjacent to the main sorting shed collects runoff from the shed and is disposed of by Thorntons.

AES have received permission from North Tipperary Co. Co. to connect to the public sewer. They have not yet connected to the sewer.
