



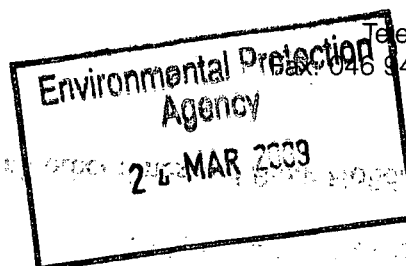

Re: EPA Waste License Application W0262-01

Applicant: Kiernan Sand and Gravel Ltd

I have no objections to the issuing of a waste license subject to the following conditions.

1. Only uncontaminated soil and stone and inert construction and demolition waste shall be accepted at the site.
2. Waste shall only be accepted at the site between the hours of 8.30a.m and 5.00p.m Monday to Friday inclusive (excluding Bank and National Holidays). No waste shall be accepted on Saturdays or Sundays.
3. The site operator shall take adequate precautions to prevent undue noise, fumes, dust, grit, untidiness and other nuisances during the course of the works which would result in a significant impairment of, or a significance interference with, amenities or the environment beyond the site boundary.
4. The developer shall make arrangements for the collection, storage and disposal of all domestic type waste arising at the site. The name of any private waste contractor employed (who shall have a valid current waste collection permit), together with the destination of the disposed waste, shall be submitted to and agreed with the Planning Authority before development commences.
5. Activities on site shall not rise to noise levels at sensitive locations which exceed the following sound pressure limits.

55 dB Laeq, 1 hour


0800 to 2000 – Monday to Friday

0800 to 1400 – Saturdays

45 DB Laeq, 15 minutes at all other times and Bank Holidays

There shall be no clearly audible tonal component or impulsive component in the noise emission from the activity at any noise sensitive location.

6. Under no circumstances shall domestic type waste be burned or buried on the site.
7. When measured at the site boundaries, dust levels shall not exceed 350mg/sq.m/day (30 day composite sample) as measured using the Bergerhoff Method, or 130mg/sq.m/day as measured on a "Frisbee" type dust gauge. Within 2 months of date of grant of permission, the developer shall submit proposals for the written agreement of the Planning Authority for the location of dust gauges and indicating which method of monitoring is to be used – Bergerhoff or Frisbee. Dust monitoring shall be carried out three times per year (twice during the period May to September), or as otherwise agreed in writing with the EPA.
8. All vehicles – other than private cars and vans – existing the site shall pass through a wheel-wash facility of suitable design and for the purpose.
9. All overground oil or chemical storage tanks (if provided) shall be adequately bunded to protect against oil spillage. Bunding should be impermeable and capable of retaining a volume equal to 110% of the capacity of the largest tank. Drainage from bunded areas should be collected and disposed of in a safe manner. The integrity and impermeability of such structures should be assessed by an independent body annually.
10. The applicant shall maintain a register of the following register on site:
 - quantities and types of waste received on site
 - quantities and types of waste not accept and details of where these wastes were sent
 - dates and times of all waste deliveries to the site
 - the names of the carriers and the registration numbers
 - the origin of each consignment of waste.
