No.	Reasons for Refusal
1	Having regard to the location of the site in a rural area served by a substandard road network, it is considered that the level and type of additional vehicle movements generated by the proposed development would give rise to significant traffic flows on an inadequate road network and by reason of its location draw additional traffic movements into the area. The proposed development would therefore interfere with the safety and free flow of traffic on the local road network, be detrimental to the quality of the county roads in the vicinity and endanger the public safety of road users including pedestrians by reason of traffic hazard. The proposed development would, therefore, be contrary to the proper planning and sustainable development of the area.

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
