Re: Proposed determination on the IPPC licence application from Newmarket Co-Operative creameries Limited, Scarteen Lower, Newmarket, Co. Cork in respect of the treatment and processing of milk, the quantity of milk received being greater than 200 tonnes per day at Scarteen Lower, Newmarket, Cork.

Dear Sir/Madam,

The Environmental Health Department has no objections to the above proposed determination from a public health view point, subject to the following:

The licensee should take into account compliance with all conditions and schedules of their integrated pollution licence and to carry out activities in such a way to protect people's health.

It is recommended that a Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point and process/product flow diagram be constructed and maintained. The flow diagram shall list each step in the process. These steps shall include all stages within the scope over which control is exercised. The flow diagram shall identify all inputs and output and any rework or recycling. It is recommended that each step be numbered.

All efforts must be made to eliminate or reduce the potential noise impacts from construction and operation of the proposed determination to a safe level and that are in compliance with the requirements of the licence.

All efforts must be made to eliminate or reduce dust, odour and gas engine emissions to the atmosphere so as to ensure compliance with the requirements of the licence.

All efforts must be made to prevent, eliminate or reduce the potential for environmental contamination of surface water or groundwater that may pose a threat to human health.

Any wastes processed at the facility must be managed under licence to prevent any impact on the drainage network.

I would recommend that extra water samples should be taken at various locations along the Mill stream and Rampart stream

and off site such as from adjacent houses and wells of the environs so as to provide a more accurate representation of the biological quality of the water in the streams.

Continuous electronic monitoring of all air emissions at specific critical points around the perimeter should be installed. Records of continuous checks must be maintained for inspection. An alarm shall be fitted to inform staff if emissions limits have being exceeded and thus action can be taken.

All control and monitoring equipment must be maintained and calibrated. Records of these checks must be maintained for inspection.
