## **Procedures for Oral Hearing**

Verbal Contributions to the Oral Hearing: All verbal contributions, presentations, questions and answers to questions, will be addressed to the Inspector. It will not be permissible to conduct any other discussions in the hall of the OH. Mobile phones should be switched off or set at silent.

Each person or group who wish to make a verbal submission will be required to set out the details of the issues they will raise in their oral submission. This will be clarified at the preliminary meeting. This will enable the inspector to proceed in an orderly manner through each oral submission and to manage the time fairly for all persons. There is no obligation on any person to make a verbal submission. The written submissions received by An Bord Pleanala will be considered fully in any event whether presented or not at the OH.

Each person speaking at the Oral Hearing should

- (1) Use the microphone
- (2) Clearly state their name
- (3) Clearly state who they are representing.

Written Contributions to the Oral Hearing. If any person wishes to submit a document(s) to the OH this should be handed in to the admin desk, 24 hours in advance of that person's evidence/appearance. The document will be numbered for reference and date stamped and passed to the inspector and his assistants. 20 Copies of such documents should also be handed in to the admin desk.

Order of Appearances at Oral Hearing: The Order of Appearances for the applicant, the prescribed bodies and for the observers is set out on the attached Outline Programme for the Oral Hearing. Schedule 1 lists the order of appearance for the prescribed bodies, Schedule 2 lists the order of appearances for the observers. The updated programme will provide information on approximate day/time of appearances. Each person will be called by the inspector in turn as set out in the schedules 1 and 2, and if not present then the programme will move forward to the next party in the order of appearance. The order set out will be strictly adhered to with the following exception.

Where a prescribed body or an observer requests it, at least 24 hours before the expected time of that person's appearance, (admin office request form) the inspector may allow that prescribed body or that observer to appear at a later time than programmed (it will not be possible to appear earlier) in the order of appearances.

Time Restrictions: Time restrictions will apply. These will be as set out in the final programme.

It is clear from the written submissions received that there is overlap and similarity between submissions. A number of submissions make the same points. Observers are asked to consider joining together in groups to avoid repetition and where such groups come together (admin office group presentation form) the inspector will facilitate additional time to the group to make their combined submission, to put the questions they require to expert witness's and to put concluding statements at the close of the OH. All persons including the applicant are asked to avoid unnecessary repetition.

Questioning will be by way of Special Topic: The special topics under which questions will be dealt with are set out in Schedule 3. This part of the OH is expected to commence on 28<sup>th</sup> May with questions from the inspector and observers regarding the Acquisition Order. Topics will be considered once and when topics are concluded no reopening of those topics will be accepted. Schedule 3 sets out the relevant EIS chapters that will be taken with each special topic. The questioning will follow in the order of appearances for observers as set out in Schedule 2.

Repetition of questions should be minimised and avoided. In order to get the maximum benefit from the time available for questions observers are urged to form groups so that repetition of questions will be avoided and so that a more complete set of questioning can be planned in advance by the group. In the event that groups are formed (at least 4/5 from the schedule 2 per group) then it is expected that a maximum of 2 hours per group per topic may be reasonable to allow for presentation of the group's own expert witness(s) and for cross questioning by the group of SEPIL expert witness's. This is an important part of the OH and it will be handled sensitively so that observers can raise the questions and make the arguments fully. Cooperation will be required from the applicant, the prescribed bodies and from observers to ensure best and fair allocation of time between all the issues and between all the observers involved.
