

Re: Waste license Review in respect of East Galway Residual Landfill site. Waste license Register No. W0178-02

We, the undersigned wish to object to the granting of a license to Greenstar Holdings Ltd for the acceptance of Hazardous Asbestos as defined by the EU Directive 2006.

The Reasons for our objection are as follows:

- In 2002, the Company was granted planning permission for a Residual Non Hazardous Facility REF 02/2811. Document ID No. 714416. This application by Greenstar to accept Hazardous Asbestos is a major change from the original permission, and in our view should be the subject of a new Planning Application and EIS.
- The Waste Facility is located on the dividing ground of water courses entering the Shannon River Basin catchment area to the East, and the Western River Basin catchment area to the West, and we have major concerns in relation to the potential risk of pollution and subsequent health implications. The soil composition in this particular area should also be taken into consideration.
- Given the fact that the applicant has failed to comply with the terms of the existing license, gives rise to a lack of confidence and grave concern that they are capable of managing this Hazardous Material. The Company's most recent conviction in the courts illustrates and confirms our concerns.
- Leading World Health Experts have conclusively and consistently proved that Asbestosi is a highly toxic carcinogenic agent, and Asbestosis is a major killer. As the waste facility is in close proximity to many residential dwellings, and the villages of Kilconnell, New Inn, Cappataggle and Woodlawn, we feel that this constitutes a major health hazard.
- Given that our Electoral Area has been the location of all major landfill dumps for over 30 years, we feel it is grossly unfair that these communities would now have to accept this toxic hazardous and life threatening waste.

We fervently urge you to refuse this application from Greenstar Holdings.
