

Location of Facility: Killaskillen, Kinnegad, Co. Meath.
Proposal: (a) To increase the quantum of alternative fuels from 50,000 tons to 95,000 tons per annum.
(b) To extend the range of permitted alternative fuels to include solid recovered fuel (SRF) and tyre derived fuels (TDF)

I have examined the EIS for IPPC licence P0487-05 and I note that

1. The applicant proposed to build tanks for the LRF "to the highest international standards". In Planning Application TA/100444 to Meath County Council the applicant proposed to use the existing tank and bund for the storage of hazardous LRF.
2. Table 10.9A Ambient Air Monitoring Results (Metals) indicate an Arsenic exceedance. This exceedance has not been adequately addressed.
3. Local householders, farms and businesses are dependent on ground water for a water supply. The developer shall make such provision as is necessary to ensure immediate mitigation of impacts to water supplies which are adversely affected by the development, during all stages of the development, with the full cost of such measures being borne by the developer. In the event of disruption to water supply any of the operations causing such disruption shall be immediately reduced or ceased, as appropriate, until the affected water supply has been restored or replaced. The developer shall record and notify the Planning Authority of complaints received and of the remedial measures implemented.
