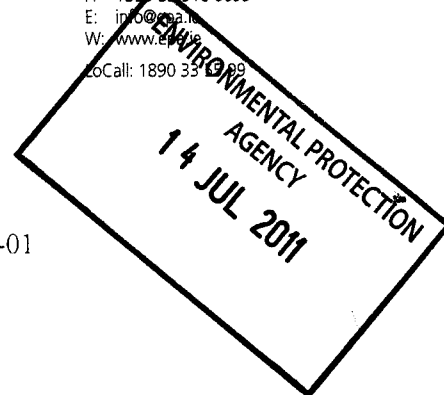

I am to refer to an application (including an Environmental Impact Statement) for an Integrated Pollution Prevention and Control licence, Reg. No. P0945-01 which was received by the Agency on 9th June 2011, from Messrs P. J. & Michael O'Reilly (T/A Annalitten Farm Eggs), C/o CLW Environmental Planners Limited, The Mews, 23 Farnham Street, in respect of their facility at Annalitten, Castleblaney, County Monaghan, under class 6.1 of the First Schedule to the EPA Acts, 1992 to 2011 - *The rearing of poultry in installations, whether within the same complex or within 100 metres of the same complex, where the capacity exceeds 40,000 places.*
