I wish to air my concerns and objection to the application for a waste Licence by the above mentioned.

I am a resident of Hollywood Rd The Tooman, Lusk, Co Dublin and have been for almost 15 years. Myself and my wife married 15 yrs ago and decided to set up home just down the road from my home house. The reason we did this was because the area is of natural beauty to say the least. We have two small children aged 11 yrs and 6 yrs who are currently pupils in the nearby Hedgestown National School. And father and mother in law also live with us in a granny flat attached to our house.

The pictureque views are breathtaking were we have fabulous sights overlooking Dublin City, Airport, Howth and Lambay Island. The country roads are used for many walkers everyday, young teenagers on their bicycles and the elderly out getting a bit of fresh air or walking their dogs. This simple way of

life is now seriously under treat by the arrival of this toxic dump which will be less than a km from our backdoor.

The volume of Trucks that would be passing our door (250 to 500 per day!!) is of a huge concern due to the speed, exhaust fumes, brake dust etc. This is something that we unfortunately had to put up with for years when Murphy Quarry was open. The roads were unable to cope with the intense volume of traffic that the road actually collapsed in places. The same road was never repaired correctly and therefore I fail to believe that it would cope with the new dump in place. Also it was due to the large volume trucks on this road that several trucks crashed into the ditch outside our home and had spilled the contents into the open ditch. luckily this content were only builders rubble but if the same thing happened with a lorry full of ash the consequences would be much greater. Also i do not believe that any research was done on the same road before the planning permission for this dump was granted. The dust from the contents of these trucks ie Bottom Ash etc would escape into our atmosphere and cause all sorts for respiratory illness. Please note that it was required that all trucks had to be covered in previous years going to the quarry but this was never followed through

These truck containing hazardous substance will also be passing our childrens school causing us concern of their safety by the roadside.

Acquifers found on site for the Nevitt dump are the same ones that will be effected should this dump go ahead. Leakages from toxic waste would effect our main water supply feeding houses and farms in the surrounding area.

As our house is so close to the site we would most definitely suffer from obvious dust, contamination and toxic fumes which would enter our atmosphere on a daily basis.

I wish to request for a proper road monitoring of traffic and dust control to be put in place on various locations along the road from 5 rds to hollywood for a comparison of a before and after scenario.
