Dear Sir / Madam,

I wish to lodge my strong objection to the proposed hazardous waste plant at Hollywood, Ballyboughal. My farm is less than 300 yards from the quarry and any potential leakages or air pollution has the potential to ruin my livelihood as well as poison the many animals which I have. I currently milk over 60 cows at my farm in Hollywood and supply over 120,000 litres of milk to Glanbia. Any potential pollution could be very dangerous if it were to enter the food chain.

Recently we spent over €6,000 sinking a new well to provide water to both my domestic residence and in order to feed my stock. This well is over 200 feet deep and could end up being polluted as a result of the waste plant.

My other concerns relate to the large amount of traffic which will travel the local roads in order to transport the dangerous materials. This provides a danger to myself as a regular user of the road and also the dirt which the trucks will generate will restrict the growth of grass and hedgegrows. I am also concerned that the trucks could leak into the ditches whilst being transported or what should happens if a traffic accident were to occur resulting in the truck over turning.

I hope you will take my points into consideration when you refuse the licence to Murphy Environmental.
