Ref. Proposed hazardous waste landfill for MEHL at Naul, Co Dublin Dear Mr Meeney.

With reference to my previous correspondence with the Agency on behalf of Nevitt Lusk Action Group (NLAG) I wish to bring the following additional matters to your attention

- In a reply to An Bord Pleanala you stated that the main concern of the EPA was potential groundwater contamination.
- In your notification to specified bodies you did not include
- A) The owners of the three closest commercial horticultural wells as previously outlined to you by the NISAG, and their representative body the IFA horticultural representative.
- B) An Bord Bia, who have responsibility for the monthly water quality testing of these wells.
- C) The GSI Groundwater Section who have responsibility for the inclusion of commercials well and all new hydrogeological data in their records.

May we remind the EPA that

- The applicant failed to establish the zones of contribution of these wells.
- The applicant failed to take into consideration the presence of a large gravel deposit supporting these wells immediately down-gradient of the MEHL site.
- The applicant failed to establish scientifically the presence of hydraulic boundaries around the MEHL site.
- The horticultural produce is processed using untreated water directly from these wells, is a significant part of the food chain, and includes major hospitals.
- The wells are protected by legislation under the EC Drinking Water Directive.
