Ref. Murphys proposed landfill at Hollywood, Co. Dublin

Dear Mr. Meeney,

We were examining some of the submissions and in particular the Health Service Executive HSE / EHS. We contacted Mr. Noel Donnelly [Environmental Health Officer] of the HSE / EHS to ask him to send on his detailed review on Soils, Geology and Hydrogeology. We were surprised that Mr. Noel Donnelly did not want to share his detailed review but in fairness to Mr. Noel Donnelly he has offered to share his detailed review if the planning process requires it.

In MEHL EIS Non Technical Summary page 27, the statement reads," the main potential impacts to geology and hydrogeology from the proposed development are; potential contamination of the aquifer and local wells". The problem is some local wells use the groundwater to process food for human consumption. The local public water supply also uses wells. These wells are suppose to have a higher level of protection. There are fault lines, shale, highly fissured bedrock, water has a high transmisstivity, groundwater movement across fault lines, pump test proving there is lots of water, artesian wells, etc..

We think everybody would be interested in reading Mr. Noel Donnelly detailed review in relation to possible contamination of the food supply, milk supply and of course the water supply for human consumption. Fingal County Council are concerned about the local public water supply being contaminated. We all know groundwater in this aquifer is used for processing of food and some of this food is sent to hospitals [like salads that is uncooked etc]. We would particularly like to read Mr. Noel Donnelly detailed review if hospitals received contaminated food that was then given to patients. What are the procedures if this happened?. What sort of problems would arise?.

We are asking you Mr. Meeney to write to Mr. Noel Donnelly HSE / EHS asking for his detailed review and then put the review onto the EPA website for all to see.
