Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to formally lodge an objection to the granting of a Dumping at Sea Permit to Dublin City Council for the dumping at sea of spoil generated by the proposed Long Sea Outfall Tunnel Project.

The alternative options 'explored' and disregarded by the council, in my opinion, have no solid justification and in many cases timing is the main reason cited for the disarding of an alternative option for the spoil. This seems like a lazy way out and the alternative options listed appear to be merely a box ticking exercise to try and give the illusion that the council gave due consideration to find the best possible fate for the spoil. Unfortunately I do not believe this to be the case, and certainly their proposal does not have the best interests of the environment at its heart.
