As far as I am aware there has been an application > for a Waste Water Discharge License made to the EPA recently (I have > attached a photo which I took but have no reference number > unfortunately). I have some concerns regarding this license being > granted as the waste water treatment plant does not adhere to the EPA > guidelines on water treatment plants. > > The guidelines say that there should be a buffer zone around a > wastewater treatment plant and that "Residential developments should > not occur within the buffer zone except in exceptional circumstances > and in no case should residential development be undertaken within the > distance outlined in Table 4. The minimum distances in Table 4 above > may need to be increased where the treatment is particularly noisy > and/or prone to odours" (Wastewaster Treatment Manuals - Treatment > Systems for Small Communities, Business, Leisure Centres and Hotels, > pg12) The table 4 referred to shows that the minimum distance for the > plant type in Cloughduv should be 50 metres. > I own the cottage adjacent to the wastewater treatment plant, and the > nearest open agitation tank is 10 metres from my boundary. > This is > completely unacceptable as it goes against the EPA guidelines on the > matter.
