Dear Sir,

We wish to object to the Planning Permission granted by Mayo County Council, on the 30th April 2004, for the above development.

The proposed development would have a detrimental effect on the people and the landscape of this pristine environment.

At the outset, I wish to say that bogs of this type are totally unsuitable for major industrial developments; the recent landslides at 'Pullathomas' and at 'Derrybrien Bog' are compelling examples of the hazards associated with such blanket bog terrain.

At the last Corrib Gas appeal, a Planning Inspector analysed all the facts and the submissions made by a plethora of experts, and then in his report agreed with all the salient points made by the objectors.

The proposed development raises major Health and Safety issues — The health and wellbeing of the people in the area; contamination of our potable water supply, pollution of our rivers and lakes, destruction of a basic infrastructure, destruction of a pristine environment, fear, security, dust, road accidents etc. etc.

There are houses less than 100 metres from the proposed site; the Aughoose river is less than 70 metres from the site – this river flows into Carrowmore Lake which is the source of the local water supply.

Specifically, the excavation and removal of 450,000 cubic metres of peat from the proposed Bellagelly South site and the deposition of the material to the Shramore site

would adversely affect the existing water adsorption capacity of the ecosystem and dramatically redefine the existing drainage system in the Ballinaboy/Leenamore/Aughoose/Glenamoy river catchment area.

Surface and ground water quality issues resulting from the removal of the existing peat deposits at the Bellanaboy site would adversely affect the physical/chemical and microbiological content of the waters in the above rivers and in Carrowmore Lake. Enrichment and contamination of the receiving waters due to a runoff of leachate and colloidal matter from the peat during excavation and redeposition is a cause for grave concern.

The provision of an access route from the proposed site at Bellanaboy to the R314 will result in a worryingly dramatic increase in HGV (Heavy goods vehicles) in the area on route to the deposition site in the townlands of Srahmore and Attavally. The air quality in the surrounds of the proposed site is pristine in nature. However the increase in HGVs plus the onsite development will result in an increase in potentially toxic gases plus noise pollution levels >85 decibels.

The main industry in the area is tourism

The area is recognised, in the current development plan, as an area of outstanding beauty. The proposed site is a hill, the contours of the hill are such that it can be seen for miles; imagine the visual impact the proposed development would have on tourists walking or cycling along roads adjoining the site.

Taking an overall view of the proposed development, our main grounds of objection are-

- The proposed development is totally out of line with proper planning and development for such a prestine environment
- The health hazards and risks involved for the locals in building a huge structure on unstable terrain
- Gas pipes under Pooncarton Hill, where we recently had a major landslide
- The Gas emissions
- The contamination of our waters
- The craziness of moving a mountain moving sludge C.11 Kilometres
- The effects of moving sludge on the people, rivers, roads, properties in the area
- The effects on our fisheries

 The effect of the proposed developments on the designated special amenity areas in the locality

The effects on Sruwaddacon Bay and our beaches

• The effect on property values in the area

I will conclude by iterating the words of an eminent journalist when he wrote an article on the proposed development and the moving of a mountain C. 11 Kilometres

- 'it is Bizarre'

The facts relating to this case are -

- A Planning Inspector of An Bord Pleanála sat for weeks on the previous application on this site listened to all the submissions made by a plethora of experts, analysed all the pertinent facts, and then in his report totally agreed with the salient points made by the objectors
- > In recent months we have had numerous landslides in the vicinity; landslides that are likely to continue. The destruction, chaos and fear that they have caused are overwhelming; anything that may trigger a similar disaster in the vicinity shouldn't be contemplated.
- ➤ The analogy of the Derrybrien Bog disaster, so graphically displayed by the media, of similar terrain to the subject site, shows how totally unsuitable sites of this kind are for major developments.
