Observation re Planning appeal Reference No: PL 16. 207212 in relation to Mayo County Council's decision to grant permission re P03/3343 to Shell Exploration & Production Limited.

Appeal re: Planning Application Ref No P03/3343 for the proposal to construct a natural gas terminal (refinery) at Ballinaboy, Bellagelly South, Co. Mayo and to remove >450,000m3 contaminated peat slurry to an area of cutaway peatland at Srahmore, near Bangor Erris, Co.Mayo by Bord na Mona Energy Group Ltd. on behalf of Shell E & P Ltd.

This is an observation in relation to a public notice advertised in the Irish Times newspaper dated the 14/06/04 which states:

"Notice is hereby given by An Bord Pleanala (the Board) under article 112 of the Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 that an environmental impact statement (EIS) has been received by the Board in accordance with section 128 of the Planning and Development Act, 2000 in respect of the appeal in the Schedule below."......

I enclose cheque in the sum of £50.00 in respect of my observation

I refer to Ballinaboy Bridge Terminal EIS (November 2000) under 4.9.2. Umbilical: "Low pressure hydraulic fluid to sea wells 210 Bar g, High pressure hydraulic fluid to sea wells 610 Bar g". This is unprecedented, the upstream pipeline is proposed to travel inland through deep peat for 9 km when it should not be allowed to do so and it should terminate at the shoreline, if an onshore refinery is involved. It is highly hazardous that this unprecedented upstream series of pipelines is allowed to pass in very close proximity to people, residential houses, under public roads, and through designated SACs and SPAs. After the Dooncarton multitude of landslides occurred in September 2003 the landfall and pipeline route should not be considered as the area has the potential to be unstable and some areas are still deemed as "high risk." The effects of "Blasting" will have an effect on the stability of Dooncarton Hill.

I refer to the N.A.O.S.H. report entitled the "Quantified risk assessment for the proposed gas terminal" dated the 25/10/02 by Mr Gareth Doran, on page 2 it states as follows:

'a full-bore or partial rupture of a pipe or storage vessel involving natural gas, if not immediately ignited will lead to the formation of a flammable gas cloud which will drift downwind being diluted as it goes. If this cloud meets a source of ignition in an uncongested area a flash fire may result. It is assumed that anyone inside the cloud will suffer fatality '.....

'If the gas cloud encounters an ignition source in an area of congestion a vapour cloud explosion may occur '....

There is no mention of the villages of Bunowna and Glenamoy and Gortacragher which are encountered downwind and if an explosion occurred within or around the refinery plant peoples lives would be at extreme risk.

In the Offshore EIS re 2001, 19.3.2.1.3.7 it states that "moving peat alters its physical and chemical properties and excessive handling can turn peat into a "mushy soup" with poor restoration potential". How can this same mushy peat be transferred on our substandard roads and deposited in Srahmore in area frequented by local rivers and in close proximity to Carrowmore Lake which is the source of drinking water for Erris.???

I refer to the terminal EIS re P03/3343 and page 5-15 and 5.4.5. "Health and Safety", which states that "Under the Seveso II Directive, the Operator has a general duty to take all measures necessary to prevent major accidents and limit their consequences to persons and the environment". This has not been carried out as the project has been split into fragments. An overall health and safety assessment has not carried out thus the true reality with respect to potential consequences has not been properly assessed. Bog bursts and peat instability plus potential for landslides in this sensitive area has not been assessed either.

The beauty of this unique landscape surrounded by SACs has not been taken into account by Mayo County Council in their assessment re the visual effects which this proposed gas terminal/refinery will have on the landscape.

As an owner of property within 0.5 km of this proposed hazardous concept I am concerned about the proposed development and its adverse effects as outlined at the various stages of the planning process to date. It creates a health and safety hazard which will result in my private property being totally devalued and deemed worthless. Who will take out insurance on my property against this unprecedented concept???.

I request that An Bord Pleanala refuse planning permission for this totally inappropriate development.
